

MNI: North American Refining (June 2025)

See overview of North American US refining sector for June and first day of July.

- **July 1 - ExxonMobil, Baytown, Texas** – Exxon reports unplanned shutdown of alkylation unit due to a compressor. Community alerted highlighted issues a day prior (Reuters sources)
- **June 30 – Irving Oil, Saint John refinery, Canada** - A fire was extinguished Monday morning following a leak. Operations are normal. (Bloomberg sources)
- **June 30 – ExxonMobil, Baytown, Texas** – operational issue resulting in flaring (community alert)
- **June 25 – Delta Air Lines's, Monroe Trainer refinery, Pennsylvania** - trying to restore normal operations by the weekend after electrical panel control issues caused multiple units to go offline late Monday, June 23. (Bloomberg sources)
- **June 25 – Delek, Big Spring refinery, Texas** - had an "equipment malfunction" at a fluid catalytic cracking unit on June 25. The issue resulted in the release of several hazardous contaminants and flaring. (TCEQ filing)
- **June 23 – Marathon, Galveston Bay refinery, Texas** - continues assessing damage to the shut 64kb/d residual hydrotreating unit. A fire at the refinery in Texas City, Texas was extinguished on the night of June 14. (Reuters sources)
- **June 23 – TotalEnergies, Port Arthur, Texas** - reported a pressure-control valve on its "purchased hydrogen line" at its reformer failed on June 23. (TCEQ filing)
- **June 20 – Valero Memphis, Tennessee refinery** – restarted its sole FCC top normal operating rates, had temporarily tripped – (Reuters sources)
- **June 18 – TotalEnergies, Port Arthur refinery, Texas** – lighting strike on June 16 caused multiple units to trip. Was working to restore operations on June 18. (Bloomberg sources)
- **June 14 – Marathon, Galveston Bay refinery, Texas** – a fire that broke out at a hydrotreater is under control. (Bloomberg sources)
- **June 13 – Marathon, Canton refinery, Ohio** - will be shut down in early July for a plantwide turnaround that will last about 60 days into mid-September. (Bloomberg sources)
- **June 13 – PBF Energy, Delaware refinery, Delaware** - refinery has repaired a water tube leak that caused excess emissions and returned a boiler to service. Leak expected to be repaired that week. (Company spokesperson)
- **June 9 - Irving Oil, Saint John refinery, Canada** - plans to restart an idled 25,000 barrel-a-day fluid catalytic cracking unit. Work will begin in June and is expected to finish in September. (IIR/Irving press release)

- **June 5 – PBF Energy, Martinez refinery, California** - preparing to restart the 27kb/d delayed coker following emergency repairs. One of the two cokers was shut May 31 when some overhead lines became plugged. (Bloomberg sources)
- **June 5 – Suncor, Montreal refinery, Canada** - plans maintenance at its 137,000 bpd Montreal refinery starting on June 5 and lasting about 2 weeks. (Regulatory filing)
