


MNI: Ukrainian Strikes on Russia's Oil Infrastructure Tracker

- Russia's crude processing volumes rose by 180k b/d to **5.5m b/d** in week to Dec. 10, Bloomberg reported.
- Runs at **Novokuibyshevsk** and **Tuapse** refineries returned to near **pre-attack levels**.
- **Strike targets have also expanded** to Caspian Sea **oil fields** and **shadow-fleet tankers** in the Black Sea
- The tables show **reported Ukrainian attacks on Russian oil infrastructure since October**. Given the frequency of attempted strikes, the list may not be exhaustive.

Refinery runs were 115k b/d as of Oct. 27
Nov-12	Stavrolen chemical plant, Stavropol Krai. Operator: Lukoil	n/a	Damage Unknown	Stavrolen is one of Russia's main producers of polyethylene and polypropylene. Also attacked Oct. 29.
Nov-11	Orsknefteorgsintez (Orsk), Orenburg Operator: FortelInvest	6m mtpa (120k b/d)	Refinery reduced runs following Nov. 11 attack. (Bloomberg Nov. 25). No further update Originally expected to restart by Nov. 16. Already suspended crude processing Nov. 10 for maintenance; drone strike delayed repairs (Kommersant)	General Staff of Ukraine claimed that one of the primary CDUs were hit. Exilenova reported a Visbreaking unit was hit. The refinery had also been attacked by a drone on Oct. 3 (Astra)
Nov-06	Sterlitamak Petrochemical Plant, Bashkortostan Operator: Gazprom NefteKhim	n/a	Operational Impact Unknown. Part of the water purification facility collapsed from previous Nov. 4 strike (Bashkortostan Governor)	The strike occurred on Nov. 6, according to Ukraine's Military Intelligence (HUR).
Nov-06	Lukoil refinery, Volgograd Operator: Lukoil	15m mtpa (300k b/d)	Crude processing exceeding 220k b/d by late November (Bloomberg) The refinery had already reduced runs for planned maintenance when it was attacked Nov. 6 (Bloomberg)	Also struck Oct. 15, Sep. 18, Aug. 12 (Kpler) The units damaged by the Nov. 6 strike were reported to be the 67k b/d CDU-5 (Bloomberg) and the 11k mt/d hydrocracker (Reuters, Bloomberg).

Oct-15	Bashneft Refining Complex , Ufa, Bashkortostan Operator: Rosneft	23.5m mtpa (472k b/d)	Ufimsky refinery increased runs to pre-attack levels by Nov. 12 (Bloomberg) Runs at the Ufaneftekhim refinery rose by more than 60% to pre-strike levels of 155k b/d by Nov. 4 (Bloomberg)	Reports of attacks on the refining complex Oct. 15 and Oct. 11 (Bloomberg) Bashneft is a complex of three oil refineries: the Novoilo, Ufimsky and Ufaneftekhim refineries.

Oct-22	Dagnotech , Makhachkala, Dagestan	1m mtpa (20k b/d)	Damage Unknown	Kyiv's General Staff claimed the attack hit one of the crude refining units, but it was not independently verified.
