

MNI: Ukrainian Strikes on Russia's Oil Infrastructure Tracker

- Russia's crude processing volumes **fell 190k b/d to 5.3m b/d** in week to Dec. 17, Bloomberg reported.
- Runs at the **Yaroslavl refinery fell by 250k b/d on the week** while processing at **Syzran climbed by 100k b/d**.
- The tables show **reported Ukrainian attacks on Russian oil infrastructure since October**. Given the frequency of attempted strikes, the list may not be exhaustive.
