

MNI: Ukrainian Strikes on Russia’s Oil Infrastructure Tracker

- **Russia’s crude processing volumes averaged around 5.28m b/d** over Feb. 5-11, the lowest seven-day average since H2 November, according to Bloomberg.
- Refineries at **Tuapse, Volgograd, and Novoshakhtinsk** remain offline.
- The tables show **reported Ukrainian attacks on Russian oil infrastructure since October**. Given the frequency of attempted strikes, the list may not be exhaustive.
