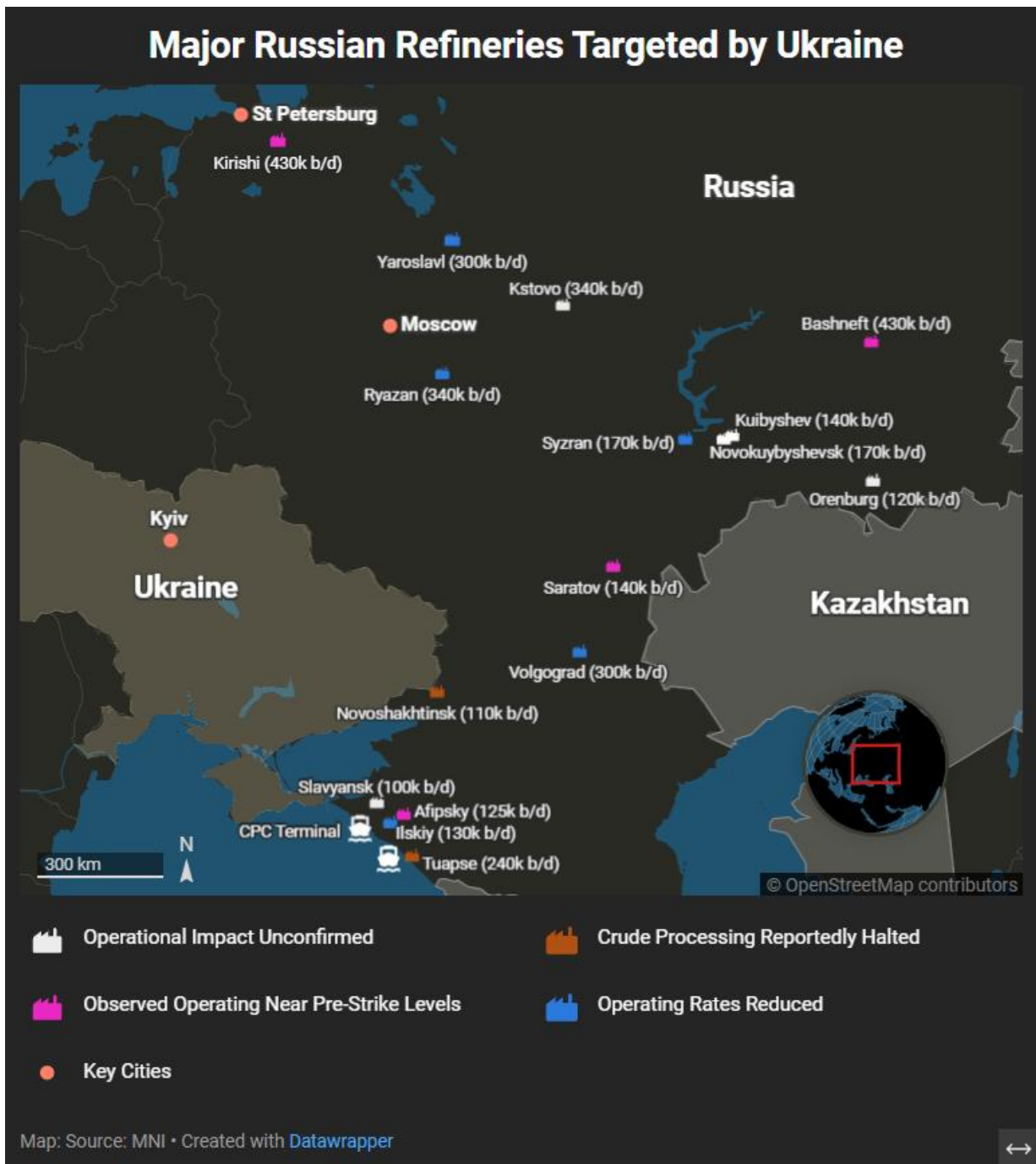


## MNI: Ukrainian Strikes on Russia’s Oil Infrastructure Tracker

- **Russia’s crude processing volumes averaged 5.3m b/d** in the first two weeks of January, according to Bloomberg.
- **Tuapse and Novoshakhtinsk halted operations**, while Lukoil’s **Volgograd reduced runs**.
- The tables show **reported Ukrainian attacks on Russian oil infrastructure since October**. Given the frequency of attempted strikes, the list may not be exhaustive.
