


MNI: Ukrainian Drone Strikes on Russian Refinery Tracker

- Ukraine continues to **target select refineries repeatedly**, striking again as repairs from previous strikes conclude.
- In addition to refineries, Ukraine also **targeted the port and export terminal of Temryuk** Dec. 5.
- The table below **lists reported Ukrainian drone attacks on Russian refining facilities since October**. Given the frequency of attempted strikes, the list may not be exhaustive.

Dec-08	Saratov Refinery , Saratov Operator: Rosneft	7m mtpa (140k b/d)	Damage from Dec. 8 attack unknown Nov. 28 attack damaged the ELOU-AVT-6 primary oil purification unit. Primary crude oil processing completely suspended as of early December and operating rates below 50% of capacity (General Staff of Ukraine Dec. 5) Prior to Nov. 28 attack, the plant stopped processing crude since the Nov. 11 attack and had already been expected to remain offline until end of November (Reuters Nov. 14). Plant had been expected to be idle until start of Dec. (Reuters) Nov. 20 caused a fire around the secondary oil processing units.(General Staff of Ukraine), while Nov. 15 attack shut down main CDU, taking 48% of capacity offline (Reuters)	Refinery attacked nine times this year: Nov. 20, Nov. 15, Oct. 23, Sep. 5, Aug. 2. Oct. 23 strike took the 80k b/d CDU-4 offline with secondary unit shutdowns including a reformer, vacuum gasoil hydrotreater, and catalytic cracker (OilPrice.Com).
Dec-05	Syzran , Samara Operator: Rosneft	8.5m mtpa (170k b/d)	Refinery halted processing Dec. 5 after CDU-6 struck. Repair work could last a month. (Reuters)	Refinery previously attacked Nov. 22, and Aug. 30, 24, and 13 (Kpler). The August strike temporarily ceased operations (RBC Ukraine)
Nov-30	Slavyansk Refinery , Krasnodar Operator: Slavyansk ECO	5.2m mtpa (100k b/d)	Operational impact unknown.	Gas pipe damaged but no fire (Astra) Also targeted Aug. 13 (Reuters)

Nov-29	Afipsky refinery , Krasnodar Operator: SAFMAR	6.25m mtpa (125k b/d)	Operational impact unknown. Some technical equipment damaged (Reuters) but tanks were not affected (Interfax)	Strike on Nov. 29, led to explosions and a fire. (General Staff of Ukraine) Also targeted Sep. 26 and twice in August
Nov-27	Novokuibyshevsk , Samara Operator: Rosneft	8.8m mtpa (170k b/d)	Damage Unknown from Nov. 27 & Nov. 16 strikes Prior to Nov. 16 strike, refinery had resumed crude processing.	Refinery was also attacked Nov. 16, Oct. 19, Aug. 28, and Aug. 2 (Kpler). The latter caused a suspension in primary oil processing. Oct 19 strike disrupted 138k b/d CDU-11 and CDU-9
Nov-25	Tuapse , Tuapse Krasnodar Krai)Operator: Rosneft	12m mtpa (240k b/d)	Processing averaged 190k b/d Nov. 20-26 after complete halt earlier in month. (Bloomberg)Refinery had resumed crude processing Nov. 21 with port also resuming exports (Reuters)	Nov. 25 attack claimed by General Staff of UkrainePrevious attack on Nov. 3 when drones struck the loading facilities (Bloomberg)
Nov-19	Ilsky , Krasnodar Krai Operator: KNGK	6.6m mtpa (130k b/d)	Damage Unknown	Nov. 19 attack was not announced by General Staff of Ukraine but by chief of Unmanned Systems Forces Robert Brovdi Refinery has been the target of multiple attacks, with a previous attack in September. Refinery runs were 115k b/d as of Oct. 27
Nov-12	Stavrolen chemical plant , Stavropol Krai. Operator: Lukoil	n/a	Damage Unknown	Stavrolen is one of Russia's main producers of polyethylene and polypropylene. Refinery was also attacked Oct. 29, with no significant damage (Reginal gov.)

Nov-11	Orsknefteorgsintez (Orsk), Orenburg Operator: ForteInvest	6m mtpa (120k b/d)	Refinery has reduced runs following Nov. 11 attack (Bloomberg Nov. 25). No further update Had originally been expected to restart by Nov. 16 after suspending crude processing for maintenance. (Kommersant)	General Staff of Ukraine claimed that one of the primary CDUs were hit. Exilenova reported a Visbreaking unit was hit. The refinery had also been attacked by a drone on Oct. 3 (Astra)
Nov-06	Sterlitamak Petrochemical Plant , Bashkortostan Operator: Gazprom NefteKhim	n/a	Damage from Nov. 6 strike unclear. Part of the water purification facility collapsed from previous Nov. 4 strike (Bashkortostan Governor)	The strike occurred on Nov. 6, according to Ukraine's Military Intelligence (HUR).
Nov-06	Lukoil refinery, Volgograd Operator: Lukoil	15m mtpa (300k b/d)	Crude processing exceeding 220k b/d by late November (Bloomberg) The refinery had already reduced runs for planned maintenance when it was attacked Nov. 6 (Bloomberg)	Also struck Oct. 15, Sep. 18, Aug. 12 (Kpler) The units damaged by the Nov. 6 strike were reported to be the 67k b/d CDU-5 (Bloomberg) and the 11k mt/d hydrocracker (Reuters, Bloomberg).
Nov-04	Nizhegorodnefteorgsintez , Kstovo, Nizhny Novgorod Operator: Lukoil	17m mtpa (340k b/d)	Lukoil confirmed that the operation of one of the processing units was temporarily suspended as of Nov. 4 (RIA). No further update since.	Refinery also attacked Oct. 15 and Oct. 5 Oct. 5. L-24/300 hydrotreatment unit possibly damaged Oct. 15 (Militarnyi) Rectification column, responsible for primary oil processing damaged Oct. 5 strike (Ukrainian Pravda)
Oct-29	NS-Oil refinery , Novospasskoye, Ulyanovsk	0.6m mtpa (12k b/d)	Damage Unknown	Locals reported hearing between 5 and 8 explosions. The plant produces gasoline, diesel and fuel oil.

Oct-29	Mariysk refinery , Mari El Republic	1.3m mtpa (26k b/d)	Damage Unknown	Ukraine's General Staff reported explosions and a fire at the facility (Interfax Ukraine). Refinery has two primary oil processing units and a vacuum fuel oil processing unit (Interfax Ukraine)
Oct-22	Dagnotech , Makhachkala, Dagestan	1m mtpa (20k b/d)	Damage Unknown	Kyiv's General Staff claimed the attack hit one of the crude refining units, but it was not independently verified.
Oct-15	Bashneft Refining Complex , Ufa, Bashkortostan Operator: Rosneft	23.5m mtpa (472k b/d)	Ufimsky refinery increased runs to pre-attack levels by Nov. 12 (Bloomberg) Runs at the Ufaneftekhim refinery rose by more than 60% to pre-strike levels of 155k b/d by Nov. 4 (Bloomberg)	Reports of attacks on the refining complex Oct. 15 and Oct. 11 (Bloomberg). Bashneft is a complex of three oil refineries: the Novoil, Ufimsky and Ufaneftekhim refineries.
Oct-04	Kirishi refinery (Kinef) , Leningrad Oblast Operator: Surgutneftegaz	20m mtpa (430k b/d)	Runs near pre-strike levels by Nov. 5 (Bloomberg)	The attack on Oct. 4 halted the 160k b/d CDU-6, the most productive unit (Reuters), Sep. 14, attack took 150k b/d primary processing unit offline. (Bloomberg)
